

# THE PRIORITY PROJECT

We're proposing a new solution to help women experiencing domestic violence secure housing and avoid homelessness

**What if you could register your investment property to provide a safe, secure rental home for women who have experienced domestic and family violence (DFV)?**

We're calling this The Priority Project (TPP). It's a private rental property register for prioritising rental to women and children impacted by DFV.

DFV is the leading cause of homelessness for women and children in Australia.

**We're raising funds for a 12-month pilot and seeking Expression of Interest from investment property owners to support the project.**

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# What is The Priority Project?

The Priority Project will connect women experiencing DFV with rental housing



## How will it work?

- 1** Women experiencing DFV who are in need of housing are referred to a **Partnership Broker** at The Priority Project by their social services / DFV case manager.
- 2** **Investment property owners (YOU)** list your rental property on the property register to provide housing to women experiencing DFV. If you express interest **now**, we will be in touch once we are ready to pilot. This is our current focus.

- 3** **The Partnership Broker matches women with appropriate properties on the property register.** The owners of properties on this register have elected to prioritise rental to tenants who have experienced DFV. A woman's needs will be considered alongside different property options. *To be eligible the woman must be referred through a DFV or housing service provider and have enough or close to enough income to afford weekly rental payments.*
- 4** **If there is a suitable property match, the woman independently signs a lease** just like a normal tenant would and will be continually supported by her DFV or housing service provider.
